How do we measure success?

Each year, we evaluate our students' performance on nationally standardized tests, and measure parent and community satisfaction with Lincoln Public Schools. We are proud of how we measure up—but we are striving to do even better.

Meeting Our Goals in a Changing Community

Our students reflect Lincoln's changing population:

- ◆ 39% of LPS students participate in the free or reduced price lunch program.
- ◆ 15% of LPS students participate in Special Education.
- ◆ More children who are learning to speak English (in 2008-09, more than 2,175 students from 60 countries who spoke 50 languages).

Although this changing population creates new challenges, we are continuing to improve our test scores and other measures of success. Community support is essential.

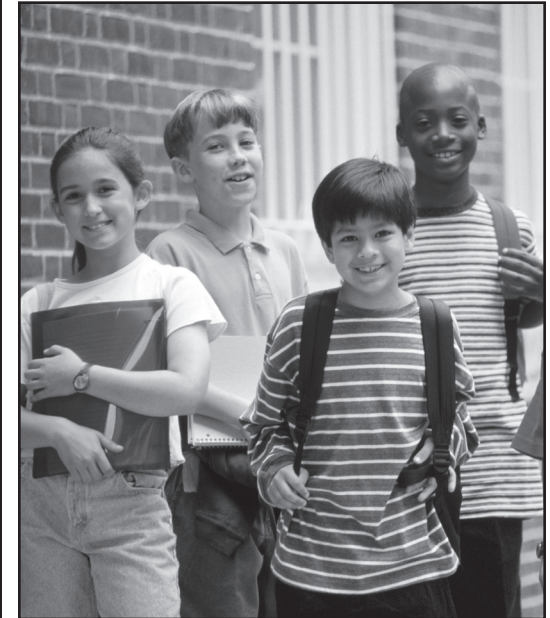

What's unique about Lakeview?

- Named for its area, Lakeview School was a one-teacher school on West P Street until 1923 when the present building was erected
- Lincoln Public Schools districts own employees, who requested and were granted the opportunity to demonstrate that their building skills equated those of the contractors building other LPS schools at the time, constructed the school
- Additions were added to the original building in 1963 and 1974
- Served by 2 bus routes
- Staff members believe parents are their child's first teacher and we respect parents' input when planning their child's educational program
- School Improvement Goal: To increase writing across all curricular areas.
- Mission Statement: Our mission as a diverse school is to encourage students to think beyond. We do this by promoting a love of learning that inspires motivated life long learners.
