All staff believes they are responsible for supporting the challenge of raising the academic abilities of Calvert students.

Celebrations from 2012-2013 Goals

The number of 3rd grade students proficient on the Math NeSA increased 13%.

There was an increase of 25% in growth, when comparing the 2011-12 third grade Free and Reduced scores of 56%, to the 2012-2013 scores of 81% in Math NeSA.

The same group of female students increased their Reading NeSA scores by 2%, from 84% in 2011-2012 third grade to 86% in 2012-2012 fourth grade.

The same group of male students increased their Reading NeSA scores by 1%, from 60% in 2011-2012 fourth grade, to 61% in 2012-2013 fifth grade.
