School Improvement Most Important Points

The Northeast School Improvement Team includes all administrators, all department chairs, and select teachers who have committed to meeting monthly to focus on school data and school-wide instructional strategies.

All students participate in weekly non-fiction writing and focus on vocabulary development in all curricular areas.

All staff participates in weekly professional learning communities (PLCs) that focus on improving achievement in their curricular areas as well as increasing the graduation rate.

Celebrations from 2012-2013 Goals

Our graduation rate has consistently increased over the course of the last three years from 72.2% in 2010 to 82.7% in 2012.

Our college-going rate has increased by 18% over the course of the last three years.

In the three years that we have implemented 9^{th} grade teaming, following the Building Assets Reducing Risks model, 9^{th} grade achievement has dramatically increased.
