- All staff focus on our School Improvement goals though Data Teams during Professional Learning community meetings.
- All students are involved in setting "Effort" goals and creating a rubric to assess and chart group progress.
- All staff set professional learning goals and participate in professional development to improve their instructional skills.

#### Celebrations from 2013-2014 Goals

- 78% of our 4th grade students met or exceeded the standards for NESA-Writing test.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students showed improvement on the NESA-Reading test from 75% meeting or exceeding standards in 2013 to 81% in 2014.
- 4th grade students showed improvement on the NESA-Reading test from 75% meeting or exceeding standards in 2013 to 83% in 2014.
- 5<sup>th</sup> grade students showed improvement on the NESA-Reading test from 75% meeting or exceeding standards in 2013 to 76% in 2014.
- 4th grade students showed great improvement on the NESA-Math test from 73% meeting or exceeding standards in 2013 to 87% in 2014.
- 5th grade students showed improvement on the NESA-Math test from 83% meeting or exceeding standards in 2013 to 85% in 2014.
- 5th grade students showed great improvement on the NESA-Science test from 57% meeting or exceeding standards in 2013 to 73% in 2014.
