#### Celebrations from 2013-2014 Goals

- NeSA Reading: Fourth and Fifth graders at Fredstrom scored above the district and state averages.
- NeSA Math: Third and Fourth graders at Fredstrom scored above the district and state averages.
- Math: Monthly PLC goals focused on number sense. The percentage of students who received either a 3 or a 4 in number sense on quarter 4 report cards:

First Grade:

• Reading Comprehension: Monthly PLC goals focused on improving reading comprehension. The percentage of students who received either a 3 or a 4 in reading comprehension on quarter 4 report cards:
