- All staff set professional learning goals and participate in professional development to improve their instructional skills. The current study of <u>Classroom Instruction That Works</u>, 2<sup>nd</sup> edition is the focus of the learning.
- All staff participates in family learning events that involve teaching parents reading and math strategies to support learning at home.

#### Celebrations from 2013-2014 Goals

#### 3rd-5th grade 2014 NeSA Reading

- The percent proficient in the subgroup of eligible for free and reduced lunch increased 7%.
- The percent proficient in the subgroup of special education increased 12%.

#### 3rd-5th arade 2014 NeSA Math
