- *Staff meets regularly in Data Teams to collaborate, evaluate data and improve instruction. (District Provided PLC Date and two flexible monthly dates as determined by teachers)
- *A new School Vision Statement was constructed with input from all stakeholders.
- *School Improvement Team made up of Team Leaders who meet bi-monthly to collaborate, evaluate and to strengthen Roper's School Improvement Process.
- *All grade levels take responsibility for providing Response To Intervention for students who need more.
- *All staff will use Wonders Reading Program with fidelity.
- *K-2 staff will use Math Expressions Curriculum with fidelity.
- *3-5 staff will use district provided math treatment lessons with fidelity.

Celebrations from 2013-2014 Goals

- *Roper third graders showed great improvement on the NeSA-Math test from 74% meeting or exceeding standards in 2013 to 82% in 2014.
- *Roper third graders showed great improvement on the NeSA-Reading test from 72% meeting or exceeding standards in 2013 to 82% in 2014.
- *Roper fifth graders continue to show improvement on the NeSA-Science test with students scoring at 47% proficiency in 2012, 52% proficiency in 2013, and 56% proficiency in 2014.
