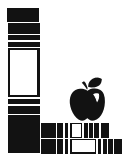

LINCOLN PUBLIC SCHOOLS SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES *Summer 2009*

Lincoln Public Schools students (Early Childhood Special Education-Grade 8) who received special education instruction during the 2008-09 school year may register for Special Education Services. Special Education Summer Services are periodic opportunities for maintenance of selected skills for students who received Special Education during the regular school year. The appropriate summer services opportunities for each individual student are determined by the IEP team.

Summer services beyond or different than those provided as part of the LPS summer services program will be provided if a child's IEP team determines, on an individual basis, that the services are necessary for the provision of a free appropriate public education to the child.

CALENDAR

May 29, 2009 Last day for registering students for special education summer services

REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

ATTENTION SPECIAL EDUCATION STUDENTS

All special education students **must** register for special education services in their home school. Last day for registering students for special education summer services will be May 29, 2009.

NONRESIDENT

Students that did NOT attend LPS special education classes this past school year (2008-09), are NOT permitted to register for special education summer services.

Lincoln Public Schools 2009 Summer Services

Screening and Evaluation Services for Children Ages Birth-to-Five

Children below age five may be referred throughout the summer months for screening and/or evaluation to determine their eligibility and need for early childhood special education or related services. These services will be provided at no charge to Lincoln families. The schedule for screening and evaluation will be arranged individually with each family. Call the Special Education Office at 436-1905 for assistance.

Early Childhood Special Education Continuous Services for Children Ages Birth-to-Three

Children who are in the birth-to-three age range, who continue to be eligible, and have been provided ECSE through a current Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP), may continue to have these services provided during the summer. Families who request ECSE services currently listed on the IFSP should list them on the registration form and return the completed form to an ECSE staff member who is currently providing service.

An ECSE staff member will contact the family to review their request for services and to arrange the schedule for summer sessions with the family. Scheduled visits may occur between the dates of June 15–July 31.

Services will be offered in both Natural Environments and an ECSE Centerbase program. Children who have been enrolled in an ECSE Centerbase program during the 2008-09 school year may participate in the Continuous Service Summer Centerbase program. Curb to curb transportation will be provided.

Early Childhood Special Education for Children Ages Three-to-Five

Children who have been enrolled in an LPS sponsored Early Childhood preschool program during the 2008-09 school year and who have a current Individual Education Program (IEP) may participate in this summer service. ECSE teachers will lead these sessions with support services provided by Occupational Therapists, Physical Therapists, Speech-Language Pathologists, or other specialists as necessary. Instruction will focus on maintenance and development of children's social, communication, motor or cognitive skills as recommended by the Student's IEP managers. Families should register eligible children for one of the schools listed below. **Transportation will be provided by the Lincoln Public Schools to and from the summer school site nearest the child's pick-up and drop off address. Children will be assigned to an 8:00 or 9:30 Session by the Special Education Department and communicated to parents prior to the first day of summer sessions. Parents may not always have their choice of early morning or late morning sessions due to transportation needs and the need to equalize numbers of children per session.**

Early Childhood Special Education Consultation Services for Children: Natural Environments Ages Three to Five

Families with a child ages 3-5 who participated in Early Childhood Special Education services during the 2008-09 school year may request consultative services from the Lincoln Public Schools ECSE staff. The family may request that the child be registered for this support by contacting the Primary Provider serving the child during the school year to arrange the appropriate service(s). The number of consultative contacts will vary with the needs of the children and staff. Lincoln Public Schools Transportation is not part of the special education summer consultation services.

Lincoln Public Schools 2009 Grades K-8 Special Education Summer Services (Elementary and Middle School Students)



K-8 School-age Consultation Services for Students Participating in Community Sponsored Programs

Summer consultation services in the areas of academic reinforcement, rec-leisure, social skills, speech-language, occupational and physical therapy, etc. are available to support elementary and middle school students who received special education services during 2008-09. Families should work with the student's IEP manager to determine appropriate participation.

If the family and the community staff providing the activity believe that consultation with personnel from Lincoln Public Schools would help the child successfully participate, the family may request this service. Consultation services may be requested by completing the LPS Summer Services form available at your school office.

The LPS summer services supervisors must approve all consultation services. If approved, the supervisor will coordinate the assignment of appropriate personnel to assist with this consultation. The number of consultative contacts will vary according to the needs of each child.

Lincoln Public Schools transportation is **not** part of the special education summer consultation services.

SUMMER ADVENTURE PROGRAM



Middle School-Summer Adventure at North Star High School

This summer class will provide a functional curriculum for 6-8 middle school students who received special education services during the 2008-09 school year. The class will meet for 14 sessions over a three week period. Students with cognitive disabilities: mild, moderate or severe/profound, students with autism or students with orthopedic impairments may enroll in this program.

Limited occupational therapy, physical therapy, interpreter services, speech-language services, hearing resource services and/or vision resource services will be available as recommended by IEP manager for students attending this session.

Transportation will be provided curb to curb for students who qualify for transportation on their IEP.

BEHAVIORAL SKILLS



Behavioral Skills Summer Program K-8

This summer service will provide the opportunity for students to participate in academic and recreational experiences that promote social skills and development of cooperative skills.

Students, grades K-8 will attend Sherrill Education Center (Behavioral Skills Program).

This program will be appropriate for students currently attending Behavioral Skills or students being served in programs for Behavioral Disorders.

Limited speech/language services will be available as recommended by IEP manager for students attending this session.

Transportation will be provided curb to curb for summer services.

Camp Learning for Students Grades K-1

The class will meet for 14 classes over a three-week period. Students recommended by their IEP manager and parent/guardian for continued practice of skills may be enrolled in the camp.

Based on students' IEPs, limited occupational therapy, physical therapy, interpreter services, speech-language services, hearing resource services, and/or vision resource services will be available as recommended by IEP managers and parent/guardian for students attending this camp.

Group transportation from designated school sites to the nearest summer school site will be provided for students who live outside the designated summer school boundary. Changes in times and locations subject to enrollments.

Based on students' IEPs, limited occupational therapy, physical therapy, interpreter services, speech-language services, hearing resource services and/or vision resource services will be available as recommended by IEP managers and parent/guardian for students attending this camp.

This two-hour summer class will focus on independent living skills and Braille instruction for students Grades K-8 who received vision services as part of their educational program during the 2008-2009 school year. The class will meet at the LPS Duplex, 1040 West Q Street, for 14 classes over the three-week summer sessions. Students recommended by their IEP manager and their parent may be enrolled. Transportation will be provided for summer services.

Strategies for Reading for Students Grades 6-8

This summer class will provide reading instruction to reinforce basic reading and comprehension skills for middle school students. The class will meet during 14 classes over a three-week period at Culler and Irving Middle Schools. Current grade **6-8** students recommended by their IEP manager and parent/guardian may be enrolled.

Limited occupational therapy, physical therapy, interpreter services, speech-language services, hearing resource services, and/or vision resource services will be available as recommended by IEP managers and parent/guardian for students attending this session. Changes in times and locations subject to enrollments.

Limited occupational therapy, physical therapy, interpreter services, speech-language services, hearing resource services, and/or vision resource services will be available as recommended by IEP managers and parent/guardian for students attending this session. Changes in times and locations subject to enrollments.
