

★ INTENT OF STUDENT HANDBOOK

This handbook is intended to be used by students, parents, and staff as a guide to the rules, regulations, and general information about Saratoga Elementary School. Each student is responsible for becoming familiar with the handbook and knowing the information contained within it. Parents are encouraged to use this handbook as a resource and to assist their child in following the procedures and rules contained in this handbook.

Although information found in this handbook contains detailed and specific information on a variety of topics, the handbook is not intended to be all encompassing so as to cover every situation and circumstance that may arise during any school day, or school year. This handbook does not create a "contract." The administration reserves the right to make decisions and rule revisions at any time to implement the educational program and to assure the well being of all students. The administration will be responsible for interpreting the rules contained in the handbook. Should the situation or circumstance arise that is not specifically covered in this handbook, the administration will make a decision based upon all applicable school district policies, and state and federal statutes and regulations.

★ LENA MERRILL COMMUNITY LEARNING CENTER

We at Saratoga School believe that students learn best when they are exposed to academically enriching experiences facilitated by caring adults in a safe, nurturing environment. In addition, we believe that adults in our community will utilize more educational, personal services when those services can be accessed at the neighborhood school. And, we believe that families involved in programs and activities at their neighborhood schools help create stronger school communities.

In an effort to create a strong school community at Saratoga and increase the personal, educational, and family service opportunities available to the community, the Lena Merrill Community Learning Center was established at Saratoga. Programs available at the Community Learning Center include before and after school programming for children in grades K-5, various adult education opportunities, and a family book club, counseling and other self-help programs.

★ AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM

The After School Program for children is offered in partnership with Family Service and will be conducted from 2:53-6:00 p.m. each day that school is in session. Students enrolled in the After School Program report to the cafeteria each day after school. Students will rotate through activities in recreation, math, special interest topics, and literacy. These activities feature guest presenters, community service, and a variety of experiential learning activities.

Clubs are also provided to students free of charge during after school hours. These clubs range in topics from dance to math and homework to Nature Club. An enrollment forms must be completed and on file before a student can start attending the After School Program or CLC Club. Behavioral expectations for student participants in the After School Program and CLC Clubs will be the same as those for the regular school day. Students who are unable or unwilling to meet these expectations may lose the privilege of participating in the After School Program or other CLC activities at Saratoga.

The Lena Merrill Community Learning Center provides a safe, academically and socially enriching environment for student before and after school. While the program provides supervision of children, we encourage participants and their families to view the program as academic enrichment as opposed to basic child care. Participants will be asked to attend the program on a regular basis and are encouraged to stay until 5:00 p.m.

We are very fortunate to be able to offer these programs to our families, and we believe that participants will benefit academically and socially, both now and in their futures.

★ SARATOGA ELEMENTARY – Title I Parent Involvement Policy

Saratoga Elementary recognizes the importance of parent involvement in student success. Collaboration between parents, school personnel and the community is essential to accomplish this goal. To provide opportunities for this collaboration, Saratoga Elementary will do the following:

- 1. Parents will be represented on the School Improvement Team and will provide feedback and suggestions for the Parent Involvement Policy.
- 2. The School Improvement Plan/Title I Plan will be shared at a parent meeting. Parents are encouraged to make suggestions for changes. The School Improvement Team will review the suggestions and respond if needed.
- 3. The Parent Involvement Policy will be included in the Parent/Student Handbook given to each family at the beginning of school.
- 4. A Title I annual parent meeting will be held at the beginning of the school year. During this meeting, information about Title I will be explained.
- 5. Parents are involved in the planning, review and improvement of the Parent Involvement Policy and the Parent/Student/School Compact at our Annual Parent Meeting where they will be informed of the building's Title 1 participation.
- 6. An end of the year survey will be sent to parents. The survey will provide the parents an opportunity to evaluate the Title I program and make suggestions related to improvements. The data will be used to make improvements at Saratoga Elementary for the next school year.
- 7. Parents will be informed about the Title I Program, school events and the curriculum through monthly newsletters, Tuesday Folders and the School Messenger phone system.

- 8. Monthly opportunities for parents to participate in with their families may include:
 - Parent Teacher Conferences
 - Family Activity Nights
 - Preschool home visits
 - One Book One Family
 - Attending student meetings such as Special Education Meetings
 - Attending School Neighborhood Advisory Committee
- 9. Information regarding after school clubs for students will be communicated through forms sent home in the Thursday Folders or in monthly newsletters.
- 10. Information about curriculum and assessments will be provided in a language and format the parents can understand. An interpreter will be called as needed for parent conferences and meetings.
- 11. Teachers will promote the volunteer program by asking parents to come into the classroom to participate in small groups and/or help students one on one. They will also be asked to volunteer at school events throughout the year.
- 12. Parents will be asked to review the compact that outlines responsibility regarding homework. Parents will also be asked to provide a quiet space for their child to complete their homework and help them when necessary.
- 13. Parents will be asked to attend at least two conferences with their child's teacher each school year.

★ Gifts, Treats, and Invitations

Classrooms recognize birthdays in a variety of ways. Students are not allowed to bring birthday treats (edible or nonedible). Please do not send gifts, party favors, balloons, or flowers. These items will not be delivered to classrooms.

Invitations will not be distributed during the school day. Teachers should be notified ahead of time if a student has invitations to distribute after school. Phone numbers and addresses cannot be distributed by any school personnel.

★ School/Classroom Parties and Celebrations

Parties and classroom celebrations (e.g., Fall, Valentine's) are at the discretion of the building principal aligned with LPS Guidelines.

Any food that is associated with classroom parties/celebrations will be provided by the school with the approval of the principal. Students or families should not bring food for their class for any occasion.

Valentines Day is an exception. Edible treats are allowed but will be sent home and not be eaten at school due to possible allergies and food sensitivities.

★ Dismissal Procedures

Students will be dismissed at 2:53 p.m. unless there are other circumstances (early dismissal, PLC, etc.) Upon dismissal students must leave the school grounds and proceed home or to a previously designated location. IT IS THE PARENT/STUDENT RESPONSIBILITY TO FOLLOW THEIR CHILD'S BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL PLAN.

- 2:53 School dismisses (last Tuesday of the month, 1:33 for Professional Learning Communities)
- Parents are asked to wait outside the Southwest playground gate at dismissal.
- Grades K-2 will be dismissed through Door 5 and will exit through the gate.
 Kindergarten and first grade classes will move to the West on Saratoga Street towards 11th Street. All other students will line up with their teacher along the side walk.
- To help with congestion, 3rd, 4th and 5th grade will be exiting door 4 by the staff parking lot. The staff parking lot will be closed for safety.
- If you are heading West on Saratoga Street, please do not get out of your car. This lane must keep moving.
- Teachers will wait with children outside until 2:58 p.m. Children not picked up by 2:58 p.m. will be escorted to the office. After 2:58, parents/guardians must come to door 1 on the East side of the building to pick up their children and sign them out.

Student Drop Off and Pick Up is **NOT PERMITTED** in the following areas:

- Southwest parking lot (off Saratoga Street)
- Northeast parking lot (off 13th Street)
- 13th Street

★ The Saratoga Way

It is important that all students contribute to a productive learning atmosphere in class. If students disrupt class due to poor behavior, they infringe on the right of other students to learn. When a student misbehaves in class, teachers will attempt to help him/her correct that behavior. If those efforts are not successful, administrative intervention may be necessary. Both teacher and administrative intervention could include **but not be limited to: problem solving, consequences, and calling a parent.** Ultimately, if efforts to correct behavior fail, a student may be suspended (both in and out) of school.

★ Telephone Use

If you choose to send a cell phone with your student to school, these are the guidelines which need to be followed:

- The school is not responsible for cell phones.
- The cell phone must be turned off, kept in backpack or turned into teachers.
- If the cell phone becomes a nuisance item, the cell phone will be taken away and given to an administrator. Parents/ guardians will be called and they will need to pick up the cell phone from the office.



Student positive behaviors will be recognized throughout the year with golden tickets and/or Starbuck awards given by teachers. This small, individual recognition promotes positive behavior. It also builds a "want to" attitude to do the right thing, even when teachers are not looking.

- Staff will communicate any club changes in a timely manner to parents
- Staff will encourage students to give their best effort during clubs
- Staff will let parents know of any disciplinary issues that affect their student

★ School Newsletter:

The Saratoga Newsletter contains Announcements, information, school events, etc. This newsletter is posted on the Saratoga School website the first of every month and will be also sent via SchoolMessenger.

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★ BULLYING



If you feel that your child is being bullied by peers, please contact your child's teacher or the building principal, Annette Bushaw. All reported incidences of bullying/unsafe behavior will follow the protocol outlined in Lincoln Public Schools Board Policy 5482: Anti-Bullying Policy.

Bullying is unwanted, aggressive behavior among school aged children that involves a real or perceived power imbalance. The behavior is repeated, or has the potential to be repeated, over time.

In order to be considered bullying, the behavior must include:

- Imbalance of Power: Kids who bully use their power—such as physical strength, access to embarrassing information, or popularity—to control or harm others. Power imbalances can change over time and in different situations, even if they involve the same people.
- Repetition: Bullying behaviors happen more than once or have the potential to happen more than once.
- Hurtful aggressive physical and/or verbal behavior.

Bullying includes actions such as making threats, spreading rumors, attacking someone physically or verbally, and excluding someone from a group on purpose.

As an added prevention piece, please discuss with your child adults in the building who they can talk to if they feel that they are being bullied or are in an unsafe situation. These people may include, but are not limited to, their teacher, the administrator, school counselor, school psychologist, school social worker or any other adult in the building that they have built a positive relationship with.

Students are taught about what bullying looks like and sounds like, along with how to advocate for themselves through the District's Second Step program.




