

Traffic Flow & Safety Tips

See the Zeman traffic map located on page 8 and 10 and on our website for more information.

To ensure the safety of children at Zeman, please adhere to the following safety procedures as you drop off and pick up your children. Please discuss these rules with your children. Please also share this information with any grandparents or neighbors who may pick your child up throughout the year. It is imperative that we all work together to maintain a safe environment for our students as they arrive and leave school each day.

Please approach the school coming from the south. Please do NOT park your car in the cutout in front of the school between the hours of 7:45 a.m. – 8:15 a.m. and 2:45 p.m. – 3:00 p.m. The cutout is reserved for the school bus and daycare vans during arrival and dismissal. During the day (8:15 a.m. – 2:30 p.m.) you can park in the cut-outs to pick up and/or if you are coming for lunch.

- During the school hours of 8:15 a.m. 2:50 p.m., please do not drive through the staff parking lot due to school, recess, and PE activities.
- If you wish to walk your child up to the building, please park on a side street.
- Do not use your cell phone during arrival and dismissal.
- Obey all traffic laws including:
 - Do not park in front of driveways
 - Park on the right hand side of the street
- Do not park in the bus-loading zone at the far north end of the cutout.
- Do not double or triple-park. Students should exit and enter their vehicle on the passenger side so they do not cross traffic.
- Students should exit their vehicle at the curb NOT in the middle of the street.
- Children and adults must use the crosswalk in front of the school.

Arrival at Zeman

LPS Bus and Daycare Vans arrival and dismissal will drop-off and pick-up at the cut-outs right in front of Zeman. If you prefer to park and walk your child up to school, please park further down on South 52nd Street or Bellhaven Dr. This allows us to keep the Zeman Cut-outs open for transportation and daycare vans.

7:45-8:10 a.m. Breakfast Traffic Flow:


- We do not have supervision until 8:00 a.m. for student scholars not receiving breakfast. Student scholars
 need to stay in their vehicle or off school property until 8:00 a.m. if they are not eating breakfast. If your
 child will be waiting in the car until 8:00, please do not pull up to door #1, but pull around to door #18
 to ensure cars bringing student scholars for breakfast can drop them off safely.
- If your child wants breakfast, please have them arrive at 7:45 or later and enter through door #1.
 Supervision is provided only for student scholars eating breakfast in the cafeteria.
- Any student arriving before 8:00 a.m. will be required to purchase breakfast. No outside food or drink is allowed in the Cafeteria.

8:00-8:15 a.m. Traffic Flow:

- When pulling into Zeman from Claire Avenue, there will only be one lane. Please do not get out of your vehicle, but continue to pull all the way forward to the unloading zone, paying attention to the traffic signs. Then, you may drop your child off.
- Student scholars must exit the passenger side onto the curb for safety purposes.
- Please do not stop before or at the bike racks to drop off your child.
- Please do not stop/park or let children out of the car in a crosswalk area, in the middle of the street/ parking lot, or near the bike rack.
- Right turn only out of the staff parking lot onto Claire Avenue.

8:00-8:10 a.m. Arrival Doors:

- ***We will no longer have outside lines. Indoor arrival daily.
 - Kindergarten will enter through door # 4 and sit supervised by their classroom until 8:08 a.m. in the hallway.
 - *Older siblings will be dropped off and picked up with their Kinder sibling. Then they will appropriately, safely, and quickly head to door #18 to the gym.



 1st-5th-grade student scholars will get out of their cars and enter through door 18. After 8:10 a.m., there will be no supervisors at door #18 and the door will be locked. Kindergarten-5th-grade student scholars will enter through door #1 to head to class.

Dismissal at Zeman

Please note: YMCA is an external organization that provides after-school care in our building.

If you would like your child to participate, please contact the YMCA directly, as Zeman does not oversee their program. Hours of operation after school are: 2:53 pm-5:45 pm.


2:53 p.m. Dismissal for the Day:

- Kindergarten student scholars will exit the building with their classroom teacher from door #4.
 - *Older siblings will be picked up with their Kinder sibling.
 - If your kindergartener is walking, they will be released once their adult is identified.
- 1st, 3rd grades will walk out their side doors #3 and #2 and head south towards the parking lot and stand next to the Zeman Sign/Marquee. Waiting for their name to be called on the radio for their ride. Walkers can start walking home, or siblings can meet at the flagpole.
- Walkers in 2nd/4th/5th will walk out of Door #1 with a grade level teacher and start walking home, and/or meet a sibling at the flag pole.
- 2nd grade will walk out of door #18 and will head south towards the stairs near the parking lot and wait for their name to be called.
- 4th grade will come out of door #12 on the East side of the building and walk south towards the parking lot and wait for their name to be called.

- **5th grade** will come out of door #11 on the East side of the building and walk south towards the parking lot and wait for their name to be called.
- If your child is walking, they will identify the adult or scholar they are walking with (flag pole meet up) and be dismissed by the teacher.
- If you would like to walk and pick up your child from the teacher, you can park on the side street of South 52nd or Bellhaven Dr., but not in the cutouts, as this is for the bus and daycare vans.
- If you want to avoid driving through the Zeman parking lot, it may be beneficial to identify a location and park so your child can walk to your vehicle. Please park further down on South 52nd Street or Bellhaven Drive to avoid causing traffic concerns for cars using the parking lot traffic plan. Please DO NOT park in neighborhood driveways.

2:53 p.m. Traffic Flow:

- Kindergarten student scholars will exit the building with their classroom teacher from door #4.
 - *Older siblings will be picked up with their Kinder sibling.
- The adult can park further down on South 52nd Street or Bellhaven Dr. and walk to get their child.
- **Grades 1st-5th:** When pulling into Zeman from Claire Ave, there will only be <u>one lane</u>.
- While in the pick-up lane:
 - Please do not stop/park or let children into the car near the bike rack, in a crosswalk area, or the middle of the street/ parking lot.



- Please do not get out of your vehicle, but continue to pull all the way forward to the **LOADING ZONE**. There will be no need to "jump" cars or weave in and out.
- We will have staff with radios calling your child's last name as identified by the name sign in your car (provided at Open House or upon enrollment throughout the year).
- When you get to the designated pick-up zone (LOADING ZONE), staff or scholars who are capable will open doors, and scholars will load on the passenger side/curbside.
- **Right turn only** out of the parking lot onto Claire Avenue.

If a child is not picked up by 3:00 p.m. the child will be escorted back into the building and parents/guardian will be called by the office staff. **The Zeman School Campus (including the playground) is closed until 5:45 p.m. except for use by the YMCA Adventure Club and by school clubs.**

Attendance

Student achievement is impacted by frequent absences and tardies. It is our goal to have every student in school as many days as possible, and to work with parents and quardians to help students understand the importance of being in school. Please note school starts at 8:15am everyday. This means scholars should be in the building and in their classroom ready for announcements and learning at 8:15 am. If scholars are walking into the school building at 8:15 am or after, they will be marked tardy. Students may be excused for illness, or if by parent request, the student may miss school for a family emergency or special family need, including a religious observance. Students may also be excused from school to participate in a school-approved activity. Students attending Zeman Elementary on permit are reminded that punctual attendance is necessary to maintain permit status.

Based on School Board Policy (Reg. 5140.1), the school may report to the county attorney when a collaborative plan involving the school, quardian, and student to reduce barriers to improve regular attendance has not been successful and the student has accumulated more than twenty (20) absences per year. *Absence codes that make up the excessive absences include: IL-Illness PA-Parent Acknowledged TR-Truant

When a student is absent from class for any reason, it becomes more difficult for the student to master the content of the course. Therefore, it is important that absences be eliminated or kept to a minimum. Equivalent experiences for students who miss class are difficult and sometime impossible to recreate. It is the responsibility of the student to make up work which has been missed because of any absence. The school staff will support the student's initiative to make up work missed. If your child is unable to attend school, a telephone call to the school office is requested. A note from home is appreciated when your child returns to school. An absence which neither the parent nor the school condones, or is not called in, will be recorded as truancy. This will be subject to disciplinary action at the discretion of the principal. If a student is excessively absent, 5+ days, an administrator will send a written notice home. If a student is absent 10 days a second notice will be sent and staff member will call home to discuss a plan to improve attendance. If a student is absent 15 days a third notice will be sent and an administrator will call to schedule a meeting. If absences exceed 20 days the administrator will file a report with the county attorney. Students are considered tardy if they are not in the building at the 8:15 a.m. bell.



Medical/Dental **Appointments** on School Time

In order for an absence to be School Excused the parent/ quardian must provide the school with documentation to demonstrate that the absence was beyond the control of the parent or child. Please follow-up with Office Staff with questions. Students must check in at the office upon departure for the appointment and on return to school. A computerized record is kept when the student is out of the building. It is necessary that the child check in and out through the office. Please send an email or call the office the previous day.

Health Information

Please notify the Health Office of any important health related information you feel is important for your child's success/safety in the classroom.

Exclusion for Health Reasons

- Temperature of 100 degrees or higher
- Undiagnosed rash/skin lesion (exception: if student is taken to physician, he/she may be readmitted with the doctor's written permission stating the rash is not contagious)
- Other conditions which may warrant a student being sent home include: inflamed red eyes or drainage; vomiting; diarrhea; persistent cough; earache or drainage from ear; questionable illness' injury which may require medical evaluation; sore that appears infected/draining.

Absences

If your child is absent 3 or more days due to communicable disease, or if injured, the student should be readmitted through the Health Office.

In questionable cases, a statement from the physician may be requested by the school nurse. Student Medications School personnel can administer medication to a student with a doctor's written prescription and signed permission from the student's parent or guardian.

Medications

Medication must be brought to school in the prescription container with a label stating the student's name, physician's name, and directions for administering the medication. Overthe-counter medication will be given with a written order from the doctor. Cough drops are considered medications but can be administered with only signed parent permission.

School-provided Formulary medication (ibuprofen or acetaminophen) can be administered to students with signed parent permission.



Make-up Work

We appreciate parent/ guardians' conscientious regard for picking up homework for their child.

- If your child will be absent only one day, work may be made up or taken home upon return to school.
- If your child will be absent for an extended period of time, please contact the classroom teacher to plan for completion of work.

Please call the school in the morning to request homework to be picked up after school.

Bullying Information

If you feel that your child is being bullied, please get in touch with your child's teacher or the building principal, Mrs. Wolfe (rwolfe3@ LPS.org). All reported incidences of bullying/unsafe behavior will follow the protocol outlined in Lincoln Public Schools Board Policy 5482: Anti-Bullying Policy.

Bullying is unwanted, aggressive behavior among school-aged children that involves a real or perceived power imbalance.

The behavior is repeated, or has the potential to be repeated, over time. In order to be considered bullying, the behavior must include:

- Imbalance of Power: Kids who bully use their power—such as physical strength, access to embarrassing information, or popularity—to control or harm others. Power imbalances can change over time and in different situations, even if they involve the same people.
- **Repetition:** Bullying behaviors happen more than once or have the potential to happen more than once.
- Hurtful aggressive physical and/or verbal behavior.

Bullying includes actions such as making threats, spreading rumors, attacking someone physically or verbally, and excluding someone from a group on purpose.

*As an added prevention piece, please remind your child that if they feel they are being bullied or in an unsafe situation, they need to tell ANY adult right away. These people may include, but are not limited to, their teacher, principal, coordinator, school counselor, school psychologist, school social worker or any other adult in the building that they have built a positive relationship with.

Students are taught what bullying looks like and sounds like, along with how to advocate for themselves through the Lincoln Public School's Second Step program.



Mental and Behavioral Health Point of Contact

Your student's mental health is important to their academic success. If you have concerns about your student's mental or behavioral health, you can contact the social worker at your student's school/program. LPS social workers are licensed mental health practitioners and can help connect you to appropriate mental health or behavioral supports. Visiting the Building

All visitors will be asked to "check in" with the office. Individuals wishing to check students out of school should sign them out in the Zeman office. The office will contact the teacher to send the student to the office. We will not call students to the office until a parent/guardian is here to sign them out as we want to limit instructional minutes lost.

Safety, Fire and Tornado Drills

All schools have periodic drills so student scholars know what to do in case of emergency, fire, or tornado in order to be safe. The safety of students is a top priority. All schools cooperate with the fire department to make sure the most effective safety procedures are followed.

Field Trips

- Parents acting as volunteers on field trips, may not bring other children so their full attention can be given to active supervision.
- Parents/Guardians who are not volunteers are strongly discouraged from bringing younger siblings on a school sponsored field trip. Field trips are connected to the LPS curriculum and are intended for the students at that grade level to have a focused learning experience.
- If the educational experience is disrupted by younger siblings or parents not acting as volunteers, they may be asked to leave the field trip.
- The school determines the number of adult volunteers needed for a field trip and may need to limit adult participation due to cost, supervision, space, security and other considerations.

Birthdays/Parties/Invitations

Teachers recognize birthdays in a variety of ways. Student scholars are not allowed to bring birthday treats (edible or non-edible). Please do not send gifts, party favors, balloons, or flowers. These items will not be delivered to classrooms.

Party invitations will not be distributed during the school day. Teachers should be notified ahead of time if a student scholar has invitations to distribute after school. Phone numbers and addresses cannot be distributed by any school personnel.

School/ Classroom Parties and Celebrations:

- Parties and classroom celebrations (e.g., Fall, Holiday, Valentine's) are at the discretion of the building principal aligned with LPS Guidelines.
- Any food that is associated with classroom parties/ celebrations will be provided by the school or parent organization with the approval of the principal.
- Students or families should not bring food for their class for any occasion. We request that only NON-EDIBLE TREATS are included in Valentine cards.
- Edible treats will be sent home and will not be eaten at school due to possible allergies and food sensitivities.

Miscellaneous Information

Student Scholar Phone Use

Students will be permitted to use the office phone to call home regarding school matters upon obtaining permission from the classroom teacher. Calls by student scholars must be kept to a minimum in order to maximize learning time. Student scholars are asked to make arrangements for participating in after-school activities or going home with a friend before leaving home in the morning.

Cell Phone / Personal Electronic Device Use

Cell phones, smart watches, and other personal electronic devices are considered nuisance items if heard or used during the school day. If students bring a personal electronic device to school, it should be kept in their backpack, or location designated by school staff during the school day and not used. The school is not responsible for damaged, lost, or stolen devices. Please note that it is unlawful, and therefore prohibited on school grounds, to take a picture or record audio or video of another person without their consent.

Does your child need to leave for an appointment? Contact the Office!

If you will be picking your child up early from school for an appointment, please contact the office to let us know. When you arrive to pick up your child, we will call the classroom and have your child come to the office to meet you. We will not have your child come to the office until you arrive.

Lost and Found

The Zeman Lost and Found is located in the cafeteria. Whenever possible, please label your child's belongings. Encourage your child to periodically check for lost items. Items not claimed will be donated to a local charity on the last day of Quarter 2 and one week after the last day of school.
