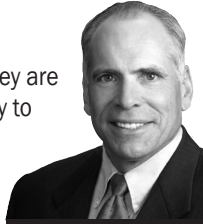

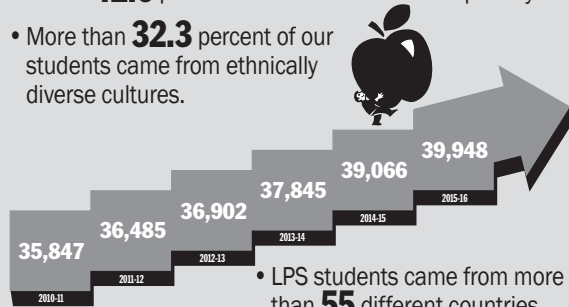

- LPS students came from more than **55** different countries.

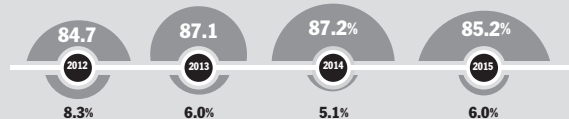

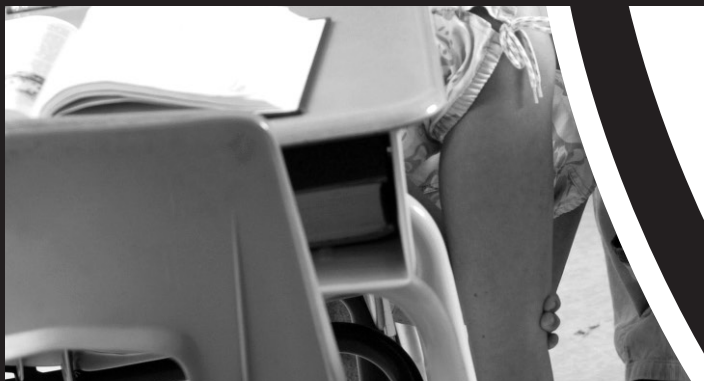
